Due to the COVID-19 outbreak in Iqaluit and the corresponding public health measures impacting Nunavut Court of Justice operations, please be advised as follows in relation to Justice of the Peace Court docketed matters:

Peace Bond

- All docketed peace bond applications have been adjourned to the June 14, 2021 sitting at 9:30 a.m. New applications will also be assigned June 14 as the return date.
- Applicants wishing to have a peace bond application heard on an urgent basis in advance of June 14 are asked to advise the Registry at the time of filing.

Municipal Court

 All docketed municipal court matters have been put to June 16, 2021 at 9:30 a.m.

Child Welfare

 All child welfare matters remain as docketed and will proceed remotely via teleconference on scheduled docket days.

Bail Hearing

- Bail hearings remain as scheduled, 1:30 p.m. and 3 p.m. each weekday for Iqaluit and community bails, respectively. Afterhours and weekend bail hearings are also not impacted by the COVID-19 outbreak.
- All bail hearings are proceeding remotely, via teleconference, until further notice.
